ANNUAL EDUCATION REPORT

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are proud to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Leslie Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about accountability, student assessment, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Our challenges are similar to those of districts around the state, attendance and achievement. We have implemented an Early Warning Signs task force to encourage student attendance. We have implemented research based interventions for Math and Reading that are showing improvement. Teachers and Support staff regularly trained in PBIS/MTSS practices to ensure a safe and engaged learning environment.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. Students are assigned to Leslie Middle School primarily by residence/district boundaries. Out of district school of choice students also attend Leslie Middle School by application.
2. Leslie Middle School continuously reviews and edits our school improvement plan periodically throughout the year as our data warrants. This plan is aligned with the

district improvement goals and is updated and submitted to the department of education annually as required.

3. Leslie Middle School is a grade 5 through 8 building.
4. The core curriculum, description of its implementation, and any explanation of the variances from the State of Michigan model is available for review in the Leslie Middle School Office (517-589-8218). Curriculum maps are also available on the school website.
5. Aggregate achievement results for local competency tests and nationally normed achievement tests are available in the Leslie Middle School Office (517-589-8218).
